# IN MEMORY OF BILL BAINS

On the 11 November 2025, Bill Bains died peacefully at home. He was a long-term member of Toc H, and for many years part of our staff team in the north.

In the mid-sixties Bill was a member of Sunderland branch, and worked in the day for British Railways delivering parcels. Part of his work included delivering wheelchairs and other disability aids to people in Washington New Town, County Durham. It was apparent to Bill that little was known of the disabled people in this fledgling community, not even their whereabouts.

So, Bill, who had previously helped found the Sunderland Society for the Disabled, sought out representatives of local charities willing to help meet the needs of the disabled people in the town. From these initial meetings emerged the ground-breaking Washington Play Scheme.

Then in December 1967, Bill was made redundant from his driving job. Soon after he was called in to see the manager of the local Labour Exchange. Although Bill didn't know him, the man had a disabled wife and knew of Bill through his work in the field. He suggested Bill - who had left school at 14 - train to be a Social Worker.

In 1972 Bill joined the Toc H staff in the Northern Region, and would remain on staff for the next twenty-two years, retiring in 1994.

His interests and achievements are almost too widespread to list but we can mention Colsterdale, Borstal lads, Youth Action Groups, and CAMEOS, to name just a few projects he was involved with.

Even after he stepped down, Bill continued to keep an interest in the work of Toc H and was an active member of our Facebook group.

**Bill leaves behind a legacy of compassion, action, and dedication to helping those in need. He will be remembered with great respect and gratitude across the Toc H family.**

# A NEW TOC H HUB IN SOMERTON, NEWPORT

Toc H is excited to be partnering with the Trustees of the RASCAL Hope Centre in Somerton, Newport, as we work together to bring new life to a much-needed community space.

The Centre has been in decline for over a decade and now sits largely empty, neglected, and in significant disrepair. Despite this, it remains an important local landmark with huge potential to once again support families and residents across the area.

We are currently exploring capital funding opportunities to address the most urgent issues including major roof repairs and identifying revenue funding to begin new family and community work.

The goal is to transform the Centre into a welcoming Toc H hub offering support for vulnerable families in crisis, alongside a programme of activities and services shaped around local needs.

It will enable us to reach new groups of people in need, rebuild a declining community resource, and demonstrates our growing positive reputation amongst communities and stakeholders across Newport.



# NEW PROJECTS IN NORTH ORMESBY, MIDDLESBROUGH

Toc H is beginning an exciting new chapter of work at the Trinity Centre in North Ormesby, Middlesbrough. We are partnering with local stakeholders to explore how the Centre can become a vibrant hub for arts, creativity and wellbeing activities, particularly for communities who have limited access to cultural opportunities.

North Ormesby is among the most deprived areas in England. The ward is ranked in the top 1% most deprived nationally under the latest measures of the Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD).

Developing creative programmes here will offer residents new ways to connect, build confidence and express themselves, while helping to address some of the economic disadvantage and social isolation experienced in the community.

Our vision for Trinity will use creativity as a tool for empowerment, inclusion and positive mental health. Over the coming months, we will be working closely with local partners to shape activities that respond directly to community needs.
